

# Summary of Calf Sightings for A Single Female Humpback Whale

This is a summary of sightings for a single female humpback whale that has been documented with seven different calves in the Kingdom of Tonga.

Note that there is a slight difference in the patterns on her left and right sides (see photos for 2012 season).


Blue = Sighted, no calf.

Red = Sighted, with calf, in Vava'u

Green = Sighted, with calf, in Ha'apai

Purple = Sighted, with calf, in both Vava'u and Ha'apai

This is the first time I have confirmation of Super Mommy from both Vava'u and Ha'apai in a single season.

## 2002 Sighting: No Calf ID Designation

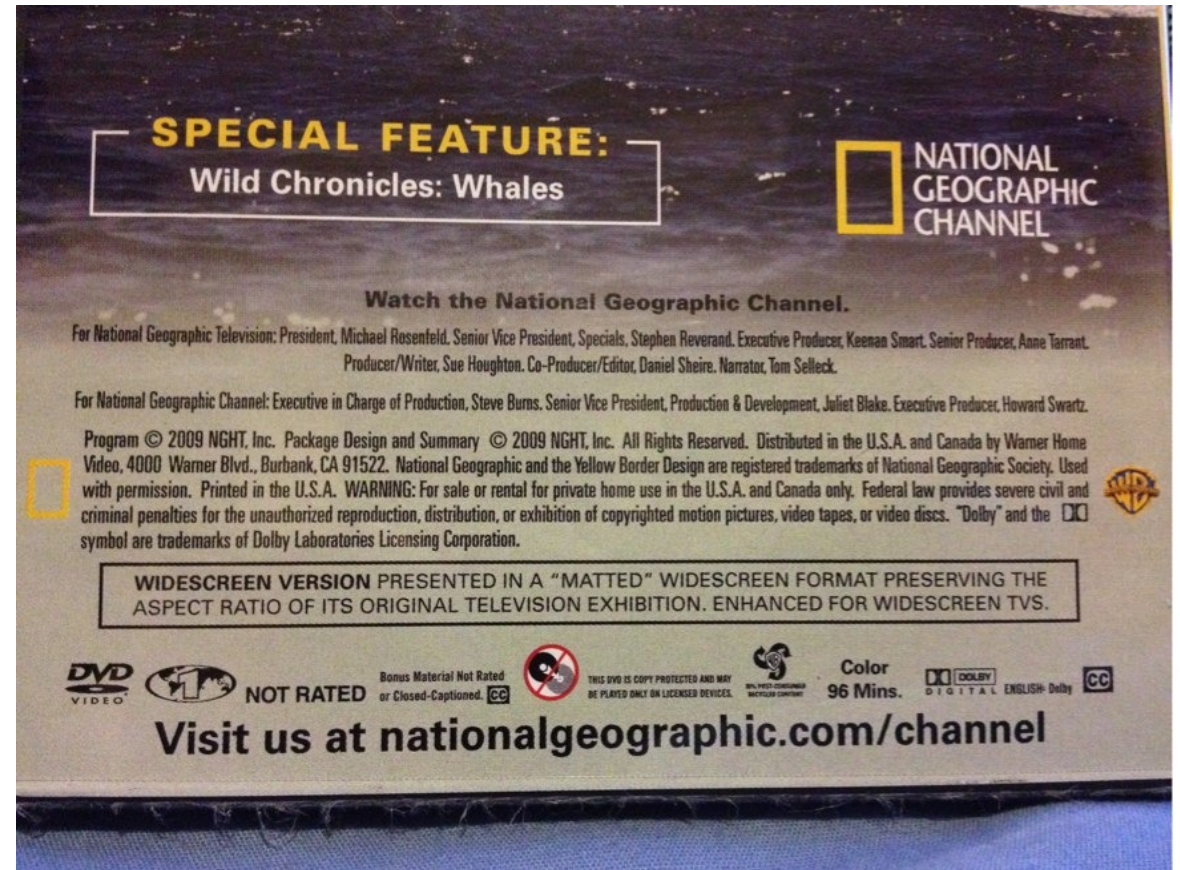
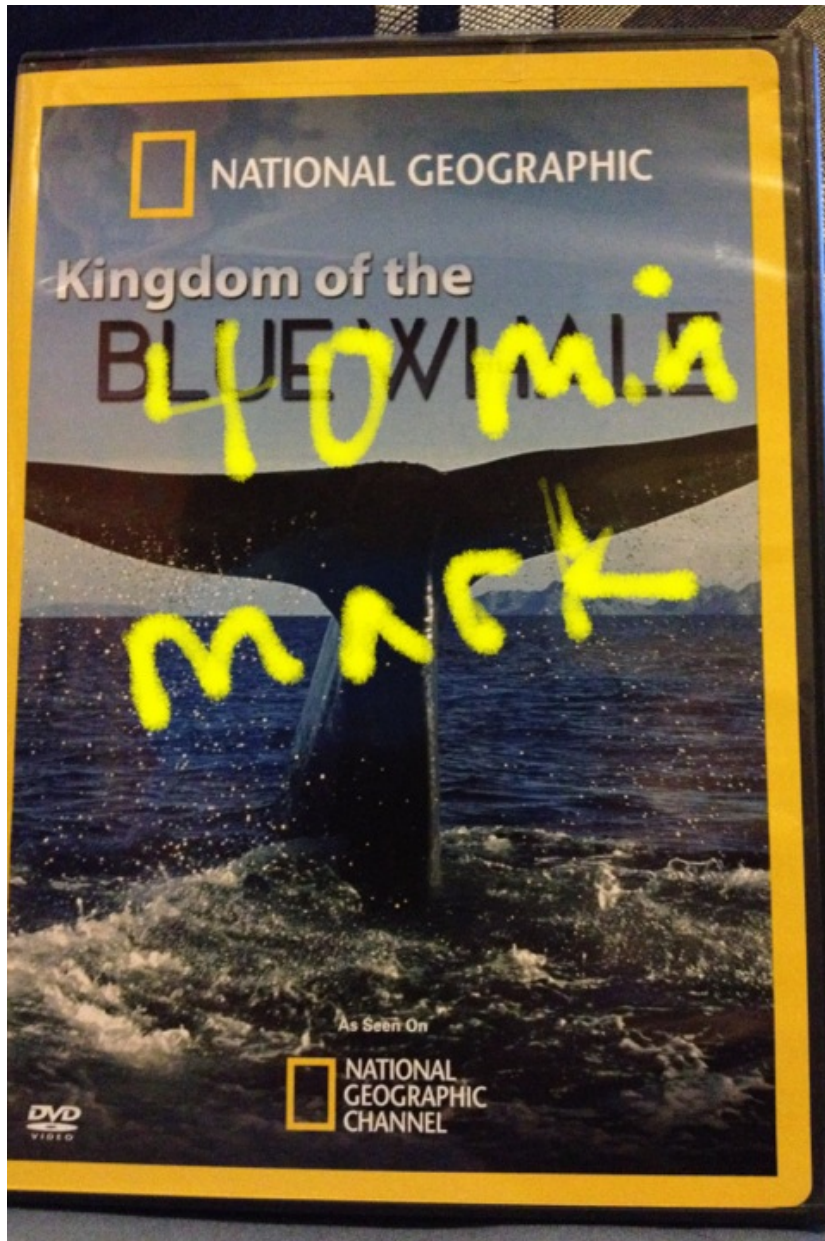


**26 September:** Location unrecorded. This photo is screen capture from a 2009 documentary titled Kingdom of the Blue Whale (see next page).
